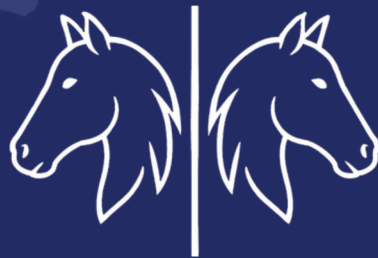


# HELP STOP THE SPREAD OF EQUINE FLU

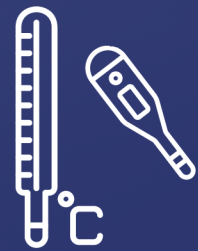
We are seeing a rise in equine flu cases across the UK and everyone can play their part in reducing the risk to British horseracing.



Make sure all your horses are vaccinated to give them the best possible protection.



Isolate any new horse for at least 14 days. Minimise movement of horses where possible.



Take the horse's rectal temperature every day. Anything above 38.5°C is not normal.



Provide each horse with their own equipment, headgear, saddle, brush, water & feed bucket.



Disinfect any shared equipment and remember to wash hands after contact.



Look for the signs of flu, including fever, nasal discharge and a harsh cough.
