

2025 Thoroughbred Industry Employee Awards, sponsored by Godolphin

21 years of honouring British racing's heroes

The <u>Thoroughbred Industry Employee Awards</u> recognise and celebrate the skill, passion and dedication of the remarkable individuals who care for our horses and support our people.

Sponsored by Godolphin and organised by the British Horseracing Authority (BHA), in association with the Racing Post and Racing TV, the Awards offer total prize money of **£128,500** – with up to **£30,000** available to a single yard or stud.

There are six award categories: Leadership Award, Dedication Award, Rider/Racing Groom Award, Stud Award, Community Award and Newcomer Award.

Winners in the Leadership, Dedication, Rider/Racing Groom and Stud categories will receive $\pounds 5,000$, with an additional $\pounds 5,000$ being awarded to their yard or stud. The two runners-up in each of these categories will receive prizes of $\pounds 2,000$, with the same amount going to their yard or stud.

The **Employee of the Year** will be selected from the winners of the Leadership, Dedication, Rider/Groom and Stud Award categories, and will receive an additional $\pounds 10,000$, with another $\pounds 10,000$ paid to their yard or stud.

The Community Award is open to any individual connected to British horseracing, as an employee or in a voluntary capacity, including in supporting services or administrative roles. This award is for someone who goes above and beyond their day-to-day role to make a positive difference to the lives of the industry people, racehorses or the communities in which racing and breeding operate, demonstrating social responsibility and championing the values of our sport.

The winner of the Community Award will receive £5,000 and an equal amount will be donated to a charity of their choosing. The two runners-up will be awarded £2,000 each, along with an equivalent amount going to a charity of their choice.

The winner of the Newcomer Award will receive $\pounds 2,000$, with the same amount going to their yard or stud, while two runners-up will receive $\pounds 1,000$ each, again, with the same amount going to their yard or stud.

Even those who make the shortlist of 10 for each category but do not progress to the final three will receive £250 in recognition of their achievement.
