The British Horseracing Authority is the governing and regulatory body for British Horseracing; we regulate, organise and represent British horseracing. We are concerned with maintaining and improving the overall health, development and growth of the sport, with the welfare of our horses and people a top priority. Our vision is simple: to build a brighter future for our sport, our horses and our people.

In this role you will conduct investigations into potential breaches of the Rules of Racing and gather intelligence to identify persons who may be involved in, or responsible for, those Rule breaches. Areas of investigation include, but are not limited to, betting; corruption; equine welfare; Anti-Doping (human and equine); conduct and suitability. Evidence of investigative experience in these fields will be advantageous, however there is a strong team of specialists to support the investigator. Part of the role will be preparing reports which may be submitted to the Gambling Commission, Police or other Law Enforcement agencies so a good working knowledge of CPIA and NIM would also be an advantage.

While you will be assisted by a strong support team, you will have immense autonomy as you visit racecourses and individuals throughout Great Britain, conducting investigations, constructing cases and gathering evidence for presentation prior to disciplinary hearings. This is a great opportunity for someone with the highest level of integrity, responsibility and professionalism, who is keen to develop their career within sports regulation and the horseracing industry.

Due to the nature of the sport, with around 1500 fixtures a year and participants based throughout Great Britain, this role involves extensive travel, both nationwide and occasionally overseas, and a willingness to adopt a flexible approach according to varying demands.

The successful candidate will have a good understanding horseracing, investigations and intelligence. Success in this role will come from the ability to communicate clearly, a high level of interpersonal skills, a strong work ethic, highest levels of probity, honesty and an ability to work to strict set processes and procedures. Good levels of computer literacy alongside the ability to prepare and submit comprehensive reports are further key skills vital to this role.

Due to the nature of the role, you will need a full valid driving license (preferably clean).

As the needs of the business change this role will change accordingly, therefore this document should be viewed as guidelines which are subject to change.
