

On 10 June 2022 the National Safeguarding Panel ('NSP') imposed a permanent exclusion order against registered Stable Employee Mr Kan Singh. The Panel found Mr Singh to have engaged in conduct that directly harmed the welfare of Person A, an Adult at Risk, contrary to section 4.1 (i) of the BHA Safeguarding Regulations. By virtue of his conduct, The Panel found that Mr Singh poses a risk of harm to post-pubescent girls and female Adults at Risk, contrary to section 4.1 (ii) of the BHA Safeguarding Regulations.

Panel found Mr Singh was attracted to the possibility of instigating violent sex against a young woman who he considered unlikely to raise the alarm or tell others, and that he sought to undermine a truthful and legitimate complaint by Person A by seeking to persuade adults that she was not telling the truth. After hearing evidence from Mr Singh, who denied the allegations, the Panel did not find him to be wholly truthful.
